Page 4 Clause 1

Delete the third paragraph and *insert* the following:

Plugs within the scope of AS/NZS 3112, cord extension sockets within the scope of AS/NZS 3120, socket-outlet adaptors within the scope of AS/NZS 3122 and cord extension sets within the scope of AS/NZS 3199, which incorporate control or conditioning functions are within the scope of this Standard.

This Amendment forms part of the Standard on publication.

Page 8 Clause 5.6.4

Add the following as a final paragraph:

Manual switches that are part of the timer function are not required to be double-pole provided they are not marked with 'OFF' or '0' (e.g. bypass switches on time-clocks do not need to be double-pole).

NOTE: The word 'OFF' in an LCD display is not considered to be a marking.

This Amendment forms part of the Standard on publication.

Page 12 Clause 10.1

Delete the first paragraph and *insert* the following:

The control device shall pass the tests listed in Table 2, such tests being carried out in the order stated. The general conditions described in the section for tests 'General' stated in AS/NZS 3100 shall be observed during the tests of this Standard.
